It's almost the summer holidays!

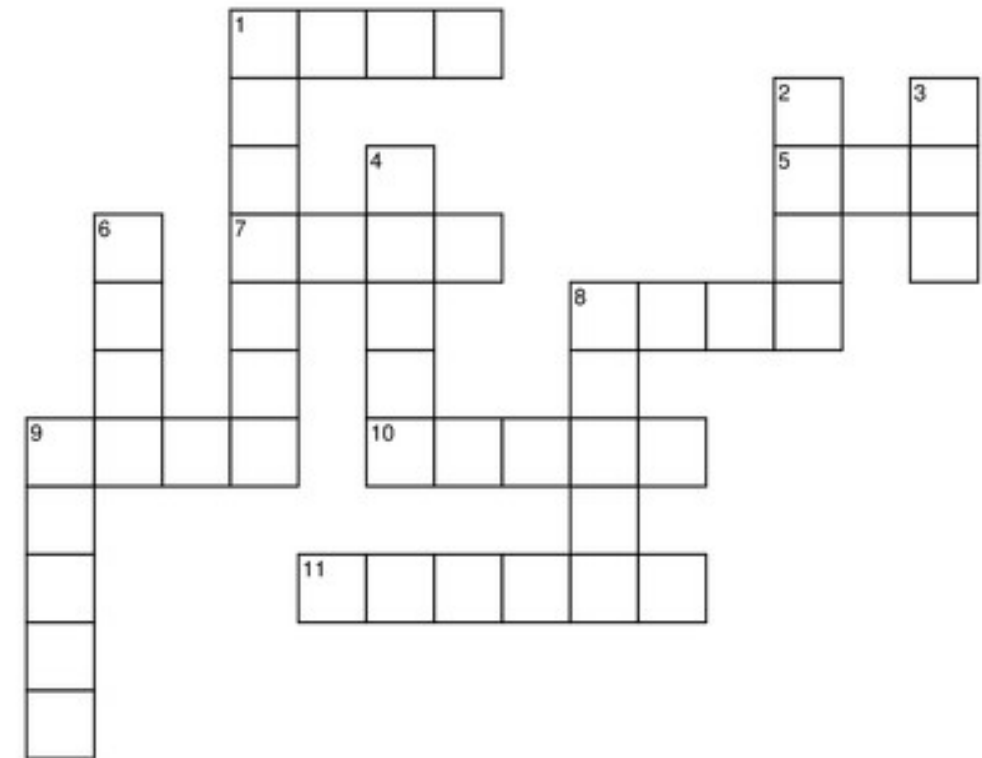

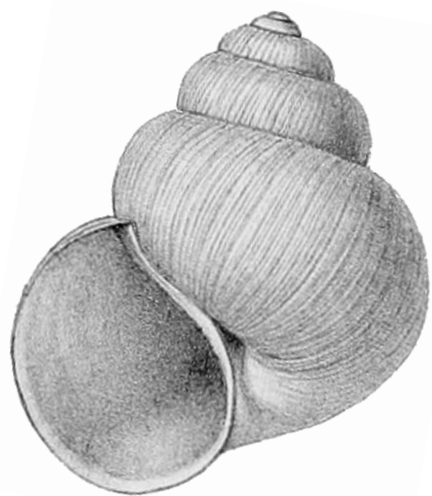
