On **Tuesday 8th October**, our daily assembly will focus on a harvest celebration. Wendy, from the Clifton food bank, came to visit the children last week to talk about poverty and the difference the food bank can make to people's lives, and we are hoping to build donations over the next few weeks so that we can make a contribution to the foodbank.

The Clifton foodbank is part of The Trussell Trust's network of 428 foodbanks, working to tackle food poverty and hunger in our local communities, as well as across the UK. Every day people in the UK go hungry for reasons ranging from redundancy to receiving an unexpected bill on a low income. A simple box of food makes a big difference, with foodbanks helping prevent crime, housing loss, family breakdown and mental health problems.

We are looking forward to being able to present our donations and would very much like it if you are able to **join us in the assembly on Tuesday 8th October at 2.50pm** as the children celebrate and think about Harvest time.

We will appreciate any donations of dried or tinned foods and know that the foodbank are running particularly low on the following items; **fruit juice, cordial, tinned meat, tinned tomatoes, tinned rice pudding, uht milk, all toiletries and tinned fruit** (please place on the table by the hall).
