
- Children initially begin to single sounds in early years. They then begin to blend and make words. They then progress onto learning further phonemes/graphemes such as digraphs, trigraphs and split vowels.
- At Crossdale, phonics is taught discreetly for 25 minutes a day. It is applied through reading, writing and spelling sessions.
- You will know if your child is working at an appropriate level based on communication with Crossdale staff.


## Phonemes/graphemes

- Phonemes are sounds.
- Graphemes are the visual representation of these sounds.

### What is the check?

- The screening check started in June 2012.
- It is a statutory 'test' for all children in Y1.
- It is seen as a 'light touch' assessment to ensure children have learnt phonics decoding and blending skills to an appropriate standard.
- The check only tests 1 element of reading...






# What happens during the check?

- The test contains 40 words.
- Children take the test on a 1:1 basis and read words aloud to a teacher.

• The check is a combination of 20 real and 20

pseudo words.

# What are real / pseudo (alien) words?

- At Crossdale, we call 'pseudo' words 'alien' words; this is the term your child will be familiar with.
- The alien words on the test will be shown next to a picture to show that it is independent from any existing vocabulary they may have.
- They are included because they are new to all pupils and do not favour those who have a visual memory for words.

## How will results be reported?

- By the end of the summer term all schools must report each child's results to their parents.
- Schools will confirm whether each child has met the standard threshold.
- Those who do not achieve the expected level will retake the test in Y2.

#### How are the results used?

- Results are used by schools to analyse their own performance and for Ofsted to use in their inspections.
- They are used to indicate whether each child in meeting the expected standard in phonics (and reading).



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# How can I help my child?

- Play lots of sound and listening games with your child.
- Read as much as possible.
- Practise the phonics homework sheets that come home with your child.
- Talk to the Base 1 team about the phonemes/graphemes your child is struggling with and need to practise.
- Encourage and praise.
- If your child is struggling to identify a word, help them to say each sound.
- Blend sounds by pointing to each one, e.g. c/a/t or g/r/ee/n.
