# Summer 1 Spellings Year One

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Spelling rule:

Adding s and es to words.

If the ending sounds like /s/ or /z/, it is spelt as -s. If the ending sounds like /z/ and forms an extra syllable or 'beat' in the word, it is spelt as -es.

Words we are learning:

cats, rocks, matches, buses, boxes

## Week 2 & 3

Spelling rule:

Adding the endings -ing, -ed and -er to verbs where no change is needed to the root word.

-ing and -er always add an extra syllable to the word and -ed sometimes does.

Words we are learning:

- 2 jumping, helping, jumper, helper, jumped, helped
- 3 buzzing, walking, buzzer, walker, buzzed, walked

#### Week 4

Spelling rule:

Adding -er and -est to adjectives where no change is needed to the root word.

If the adjective ends in two consonant letters (the same or different), the ending is simply added on.

Words we are learning:

fresher, freshest, quicker, quickest, slower,

#### Week, 5

Spelling rule:

Words ending in -y (/i:/ or /I/).

Words we are learning:

very, happy, funny, party, family

### Week 6

Spelling rule:

New consonant spellings ph and wh.

The /f/ sound is not usually spelt as **ph** in

short everyday words (e.g. fat, fill, fun).

Words we are learning:

dolphin, elephant, when, where, while
