Memorial Walk

Do you know anyone affected by cancer, past or present? Do you want to show your support as an individual, family or group? Are you, yourself a sufferer? Is the Race for Life too formal for you? Do you want to bring a wheelchair, back-carrier or pushchair, take a gentle, contemplative stroll, or just walk the dog? If yes, then the Memorial Walk is for you. Totally inclusive, children and adults have, in the past, used ingenious methods to get around the lake e.g. skipping, skating, walking backwards, unicycling.

Moira Kelly was diagnosed with breast cancer whilst pregnant. Imagine the shock, and the effect on family, friends, and the community. She died in November 2004, at the age of 40 after a brave 11-month battle. A wife to Steve and a working mother to three young girls then aged 6, 4 and 1 - Alice, Emily & Isabel Wong.

Back in 2005, parents at Crossdale Drive Primary School, joined by staff, family, friends and pets, organised the first walk around the lake in Moira's memory. Since then, community groups, including 4th Keyworth Brownies and 1st Keyworth Scouts have also taken
