

# Writing

MI

- Handwriting letter join

- Some words you may hear and wonder about!
  - Hot / cold tasks: at the start of each unit covered, children will do a pre-assessment called a cold task, an independent piece of writing at the end a hot task. Next steps for each child are set from these pieces of writing.
  - Steps to Success: we use these to help guide the children to their learning goals
  - <u>Stars and Steps</u>: we mark stars on our steps to success to identify strengths (stars) in their writing and things that could be better (next steps / targets to aim for)
  - RR (Reflect in Red): used by the teacher to indicate where an improvement is needed; children write their respond/improvement in red
  - WALT our learning objective
  - VIPERS: our whole-class reading lessons




