Information for parents, following a reported case of COVID-19 in your child's class

If a positive case of COVID-19 is reported in your child's class, you will be emailed a link to <u>information on our school website</u>. Within this information, we have included the following;

Although lateral flow testing is not typically recommended for primary school aged children, you might feel comfortable doing these tests at home with your child to offer some reassurance. We are aware that some families continue to use lateral flow testing with primary aged children to help identify asymptomatic cases.

If your child develops symptoms of COVID-19, they must not come to school and should remain at home for at least **10 days** from the date when their symptoms appeared. Anyone with symptoms will be eligible for testing and this can be arranged via <u>https://www.nhs.uk/ask-for-a-coronavirus-test or by calling 119</u>.

All other household members who remain well no longer have to self-isolate, as long as they are fully vaccinated (defined as having received the recommended doses of a MHRA-approved vaccination in the UK, with the last dose being at least 14 days before the exposure to COVID-19), medically exempt from vaccination, or aged under 18 years and six months: <u>Stay at home: guidance for households with possible or confirmed coronavirus (COVID-19) infection - GOV.UK (www.gov.uk)</u>.

Please note, that as outlined in the above paragraph, if you have more than one child in your household and one child has tested positive, but others are well and have not tested positive, they should still come to school. If you choose to keep them at home, they will receive an unauthorised absence mark in the register and we will be unable to provide any home learning resources, as the government guidance states that they should be in school. We do appreciate that this may feel unintuitive, but as a school, we have to follow the guidance issued.
