Alexander the Great dies aged 33.


Key Vocabulary ancient something from a very long time ago. a system where the people of a country or democracy a state are involved in the way it's run. a group of countries or states that are empire ruled by one ruler or country. small areas that ancient Greece was city states divided into, each with their own governments, laws and army. Olympic a major international sporting event held every four years. games a society with well-developed rules and civilisation government, often where technology and the arts are considered important. something that lives on after someone legacy dies or an event ends.

Who was Alexander the Great?

Took over his fathers (King Phillip II) empire after he passed away in 336 BC. This empire included all of ancient Greece.

Invaded many other countries, including Egypt and India, to expand his empire. This became the largest empire in history.

After his death, the Greek empire broke up, but Greek culture still remains strong in many of these places.
