How does climate affect people's lives?

People have to adapt to the climate they live in. This means that people living in different climates have different lifestyles. Climate change is causing extreme weather events, including severe storms, cyclones, floods, sandstorms, heatwaves and droughts. The Global Climate Risk Index ranks the countries that are most affected by the effects of extreme weather related to climate change.

How does industry affect an area?

Industry can have a damaging effect on the environment where it is taking place, and also further away. For example:

- tourism leads to loss of habitat and congestion
- factories produce toxic waste chemicals that pollute the environment.

Where do we get our resources from?

Countries worldwide export and import fossil fuels, metal ores, food and manufactured products. The availability of natural resources, the climate and the type of soil in different countries influence what they export. Resources move across the globe by rail, road, sea and air transport.
