What do I already know? The children have a developing understanding of their locality and the world. They know they live in Keyworth and that this is a small village near Nottingham. Many children will have experience of visiting different places in the UK, including London as well as abroad. Previous geography topics: St Lucia and Local Study, London. Children should know the 4 countries and capital cities of the UK and understand what physical / human features are.

Australia is hotter than the UK for much more of the year.


There are lots of different plants that grow there such as: eucalyptus and acacia.

Some animals that can be found there include: sharks, dangerous spiders, kangaroos, platypus.


What are the 7 continents and 5 oceans of the world?
