## What was rationing?





During the war, there was a shortage of some foods so rationing was introduced. This meant that each person could only buy a certain amount of each food each week. Everyone was given a ration book to show how much they were allowed to buy each week. Rationed foods included: butter, sugar, milk, cheese and bacon.

German planes dropped bombs on British cities in an attempt to destroy factories, dockyards and airfields but homes and schools were also hit. The government decided to evacuate children from the cities to the countryside where they would be safer.

### What was The Blitz?



The Blitz is the name for the bombing of British cities and sirens were sounded to warn people. They used air raid shelters (which were sometimes in their gardens) to escape the bombs.
