Monarch 	The King or Queen.
Steam train 	A train powered by steam
Promenade 	A path next to the beach where people go for a walk.
Victorian 	The time where Queen Victoria ruled.
Souvenir 	Something kept as a reminder of a place or event.
Bathing machine 	A wheeled cart that is pulled down to the edge of the sea and used for changing.

Reign 2022-present

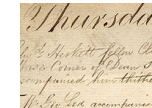
- *We are Caroleans!

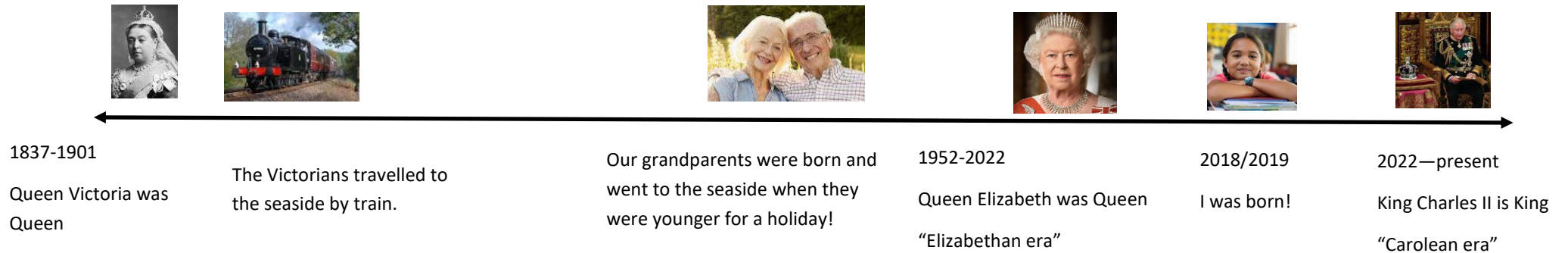
