The Tudors

This half-term, the children are learning all about how the Tudors changed Britain. We will be learning all about how Henry VIII broke from the Roman Catholic Church and set up The Church of England and the impact this had on Britain. These homework tasks are designed to help children learn more about life during the Tudor times, as well as build on knowledge already learned in lessons.

Choose at least one homework task to complete ready for our topic showcase afternoon on Tuesday 19th May!

Research food that was eaten by Tudor royals and design a banquet for Henry VIII!

Use the internet to research Tudor houses. Create your own model of a Tudor house.

What materials were used to build Tudor houses?

What are the key features of Tudor houses?

Research the Tudor coat of arms. Why is a coat of arms so important?

Can you design your own Tudor coat of arms which includes meaningful symbols, Tudor colours and family mottos?

Research what life was like for a child in Tudor Britain (when Britain was either Catholic or Anglican)

Write a diary entry from the perspective of a Tudor child.

- What was their daily life like?
- What did they have to do as a Catholic or Protestant?
 - Did they go to school?
 - Did they have to work?

Research more information about one of Henry VIII's wives.

Put your findings into a poster.
